REVIEW AND APPROVE MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING HELD SEPTEMBER 14, 2017 AND SPECIAL JOINT MEETING HELD SEPTEMBER 21, 2017.

CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON PROJECT AGREEMENT WITH VALLEY INITIATIVE FOR DEVELOPMENT AND ADVANCEMENT.

The Valley Initiative for Development and Advancement or VIDA assists low income students with post-secondary occupational training in fields such as allied health, business, manufacturing, social services, specialized trades and technology. Ms. Maldonado made a motion to approve the

project agreement and a donation of five thousand dollars to Valley Initiative for development and advancement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Garcia and passed unanimously.

CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO AUTHORIZE STAFF TO DEMAND AND PURSUE PAYMENT FOR AN OVERDUE LOAN FROM SOUTH TEXAS COLLABORATIVE HOUSING DEVELOPMENT.

In February 2014 the LFEDC approved a loan to South Texas Collaborative housing development in the amount of \$100,000. The loan was set to mature on February 7, 2016. Ms. Maldonado made a motion to authorize staff to demand and pursue payment for an overdue loan from South Texas Collaborative housing Development. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hoff and passed unanimously.
